RABBI'S MESSAGE:

THE PAST LINGERS, FADES AND BECOMES THE FUTURE

Last December's ice storm is in the history books. Long gone is the background roar of the generators, the twice-daily trips to the gas station to refuel them, the sound of the snow blowers and the mess from the snow plows.

But a look at the yards, the neighborhoods and the hillsides still show scars of that storm. There are broken off trees; there are uprooted trees; there are still downed limbs everywhere. The task of clean up seems daunting but for those of us doing it ourselves, it does afford a reflection on the prayer of Reb Nahman of Bratslav:

O God, Grant me the ability to be alone! May it be my custom to go outdoors each day among the trees and grass - among all growing things, and there may I be alone, and enter into prayer ...

Barely six-months later, some of the raw surfaces on the broken trees are healing and blending in, downed branches are merging in with the ground cover providing the ground fresh nutrients and as I chip the broken limbs into compost heaps, what appeared to be catastrophic destruction, now is integrating itself into the surroundings.


The larger limbs I am chain-sawing into logs and kindling and stacked to dry for the winter of 2012, when the efforts of 2009 are a glimmer of a memory but a continuing reality.

Somehow it seems like a metaphor of life: The efforts of today provide subtle transitions and benefits to facilitate the future.

- ★ WORLD JEWRY—"We Are All Brothers" (this includes detailed knowledge of the map of Israel, describing certain people's and organization's involvement in the rebuilding of Israel, and knowledge of worldwide Jewry).







How the Program Works

Youth through age 18 can raise money for a trip to Israel by asking family and friends to plant trees with JNF. Half of the proceeds of each donation (\$36 minimum) will go towards planting a tree in Israel and the other half goes into a student account which can be redeemed for any trip to Israel. Special tree certificates (one per each \$36 donation) is sent to a designee on behalf of the donor. Funds may be redeemed when a total of 10 sales have been made, and \$180 is accrued towards the student trip.
