RABBI'S MESSAGE: IT'S ALL ABOUT THE KIDS? NOT.

For the people who get it, they find their way there! They have mastered the skills and they enjoy the experience of being there. They go through the mechanics and they talk to the other people whom they encounter. While they share a space with many people, they are also alone with God. And although they have done it many times there is something on a higher plane that keeps them returning again and again. They can do this at many locations in the world and the skills when mastered, readily transfer.

For some who don't get it, they may drop out. But when they get older and have a family of their own, they figure, "I remember doing it as a kid and it is something that kids do." Occasionally, by seeing the experience that their children are having, they figure – maybe this is worth my learning about this in greater depth.

Others realize that this venue is a totally safe place for teenage children to be with their families, at a time in life when teens don't want to be seen with their families anywhere else.

Some, who didn't figure out what they missed when they were younger, all of a sudden get it at second exposure. They recognize the abiding value and beauty of what they are experiencing and become intimately involved with it for the rest of their lives. And there are others who drop out again and aren't seen until the grandchildren are ready for this piece of cultural, societal exposure.

Still others, who had no exposure to it in their youth, just try it and become converts to this spiritual experience.

This month is Purim and I hope you will join us at the temple when we turn the world upside down and experience the levity of Judaism. By the way: In the spirit of Purim, the above paragraphs are about skiing and ski areas – but it could equally well have been about Judaism and synagogues.


