RABBI'S MESSAGE: PURIM AND SHA-LACH MA-NOS(T)

The vast majority of Jewish holidays are about God and God's relationship with the Jewish people. It may be spiritual; it may be agricultural – but it's about God.

One way to look at the Purim story is how a secular Jew, Esther, can save the religious Jewish Community as embodied in and by Mordechai! You'll notice: Mordechai's initial problem with Haman is that his Jewishness prevents him from showing Haman the honor that would have been expected by a Persian official in the Persian culture. Mordechai advises Esther not to let on to her Jewishness, because she can be more helpful to her fellow Jews if she "doesn't wear her Judaism on her sleeve." Mordechai's ascent to power comes from Esther's power in spite of his Jewishness!

In our Jewish community, we cross all lines: religious and secular; educated and uneducated; white collar and blue collar and so on. The Purim story teaches us that when push comes to shove, we survive by helping each other across all of the above mentioned lines and more.

Most Jewish holidays have a tradition of giving *tse-da-ka* (charity). The holiday of Purim is the only one that mandates the giving of gifts to our fellow Jews and not just those in need. I was taught as a child that the purpose of these gifts at Purim, called *sha-lach ma-nos(t)*, was to remind each other of how nice it is to receive a gift when we don't need it. Therefore, how much more important it must be to give gifts to those who really need it.

With the theme of Purim being about Jews helping other Jews, perhaps a little gift of *sha-lach ma-nos(t)* to one or more of your friends in the community would be an appropriate way. Often the gift is nothing more than a couple of cookies (or cupcakes). It helps put the community in perspective and let others know that we care about each other in more than just a theoretical abstract.





HAVDALLAH & MOVIE WITH ORE AYAH DAGAN


Saturday, April 30

In 1909, in response to the Aryan Paragraph which forbade Austrian sports clubs from accepting Jews, the Jewish sports club Hakoah (the strength) Vienna was formed. Watermarks (Hakoah Lischot) is about their champion women's swim team: their rise to greatness; their refusal to compete in the 1936 Olympics in Nazi Berlin; the striking of all their records; their escape from the country prior to the war; and their coming together, 65 years later, to tell their story.











