# RABBI'S MESSAGE: WHAT IS APPROPRIATE FOR PRAYER?

As I sit looking out my window at yet another snow storm, I am also watching the news with the reporters doing their obligatory interviews. As one might expect, the majority of the interviewees are indicating that they've already had enough!

A Jewish concept is that a blessing (*be-ra-cha*) should never be offered if there is no possibility of changing reality. For example, if a fire engine passes us on the road home, it is improper to offer the prayer, "God: I pray that it is not my house." It is a done deal. Either it is or it isn't.

Many of my skiing buddies know that I am a rabbi and assume (erroneously) that I have a direct channel to God. In a bad snow year, they will chide me saying, "Can't you do something about it?" The most I've ever done is to place a bumper sticker on my car stating, "Pray for Snow" which of course is as much a "blessing in vain (*be-ra-cha le-va-ta-la*)" as my fire example above.

Given my love for snow, I can't imagine how unhappy most of you would be with me if I had any power to make it snow!

The challenge that faces all of us when dealing with a snow storm, a hurricane, an earthquake or any "act of God" is to find ways to enjoy it or at the very least, make the best of it. Often, these kinds of adversity bring out the best in people with neighbors helping neighbors. Without the emergency all too often, we would never do more than say, "Hello."

So regardless of the situation, it is always appropriate to be in the moment and to say, "Ba-ruch a-ta A-do-nai, e-lo-hei'-nu me'-lech ha-o-lam, she-he-che-ya'-nu, ve-ki-ye-ma'-nu, ve-hi-gi-ya'-nu la-ze-man ha-zeh. Praised be You, our God, Ruler of the universe, Who kept us alive, sustained us and enabled us to reach this occasion."


In 1940, a dedicated and concerned group of Americans realized the importance of Magen David Adom in Palestine, which was officially chartered and recognized as an emergency lifesaving service as a result of the murderous riots of 1929, when Jewish farming and urban settlements were attacked by the Arab population. Under the auspices of the B'nai Zion organization, and, particularly, the leadership of Herman Z. Quittman and Dr. Harris Levine, "American Red Magen David for Israel (ARMDI)" was incorporated in the State of New York to give medical assistance to the people of Israel (then Palestine).

Want to help? We need help with setup and cleanup, and volunteers for D'var Torah.




