RABBI'S MESSAGE: SYNAGOGUE ARCHITECTURE-CONFIRMATION

Synagogue Architecture: Ski instructors are a very varied group of people. One of my fellow instructors at Crotched Mountain is Professor Susan Wadsworth of Fitchburg State College. In the winter just completed, Susan asked me some questions about synagogue architecture and I sent her a number of web-sites of some of the more spectacular synagogues in the United States.

With that information, she put together a PowerPoint of which she sent me a copy. I asked her if she would be willing to present her work at Betenu and the fact she is scheduled for May 13 is a good indication that her answer was, "yes!" Please be on time as the presentation will occur at 7:30 PM, right at the beginning of the service.

For those of us who spend most of our synagogue time in our humble facility, this will be a great opportunity to see some of America's most beautiful and ornate synagogues and have the benefit of Professor Wadsworth's expertise to give us her professional insights.


