Many of you already know that Karen and I are downsizing and toward that goal, one has to go through files and papers and books. We will have lived in this our Scott Avenue home for almost 19 years. While going over papers, I went through my memorabilia from the two years I spent in Williamson, WV as a student Rabbi from 1981-3.

Student pulpits at the time were monthly, tri-weekly or bi-weekly (plus High Holydays). Williamson was a tri-weekly, nominally, 12 visits per year. As I finished my sermon on my final visit of 1982, I turned over the pulpit to the president for announcements. I remember him saying, "Not much to announce other than 'school's out for the summer!'"

There are lay led services over the summer, board meetings and planning for the fall. The values of Judaism never take a vacation, but the formal institutions of Judaism go into estivation.

So as we transition into summer, I reprise those words from Williamson, "Not much to announce other than 'school's out for the summer!'"





To Matt Spokane on reaching Eagle Rank in the Boy Scouts of America

Eagle Rank Requirements:

- 1. Be active in your troop, team, crew, or ship for a period of at least 6 months after you have achieved the rank of Life Scout.
- 2. Demonstrate that you live by the principles of the Scout Oath and Law in your daily life. List the names of individuals who know you personally and would be willing to provide a recommendation on your behalf, including parents/guardians, religious, educational, and employer references.
- 3. Earn a total of 21 merit badges (10 more than you already have).
- 4. While a Life Scout, serve actively for a period of 6 months in one or more (specific) positions of responsibility.
- 5. While a Life Scout, plan, develop, and give leadership to others in a service project helpful to any religious institution, any school, or your community.
- 6. Take part in a Scoutmaster conference.
- 7. Successfully complete an Eagle Scout board of review.






SCHOOL TZEDAKAH-




