SAYING GOODBYE

A few years ago, the finance committee came to me and told me, "There is no way we can see for Betenu to continue without you." I swallowed the Kool-Aid and determined that I could never retire.

Betenu might not survive my mortality, but I wasn't going to let it die on my watch.

I was pleased when a number of our Board Members stepped up and said, "We're going to try." I was very pleased that about half of Betenu's member families were represented at the meeting on March 4 where the path to Betenu's future and my retirement were outlined.

For those of you who weren't there, I'd like to reprise a few of my comments:

- 1. While Betenu incorporated in Nov. 1983, Betenu really started in the spring of 1984. To test the waters we asked for \$50 per family with most of the money used to buy prayer books. Yes, to be listed as a charter member of Betenu required a meager investment of \$50!
- 2. In the autumn of 1984, I was under contract with Congregation Ahavas Achim in Keene. Betenu's services were lay led by Marian Weisenfeld and the Grinsteins all of whom have since moved out of the area. By the way, those first services were well attended, actually outdrawing the services that I led in Keene.
- 3. We had no assets. While we used our funds to buy Gates of Prayer, we used the old 1944 Reform High Holyday prayer book, copies of which we scrounged from a congregation who gave them to us for the price of postage. By the way, those books are still on a shelf in our library.
- 4. When Betenu moved into this structure in 1992, we had 29 paying families, a balanced budget and a mortgage.

Today, we have a library, that's not worth much to sell, but is probably worth \$10K if we had to replace it.

We have two Sifrei Torah and a Megillah; probably worth \$10 to\$12K to sell, but probably closer to \$20K if we had to replace them.

We own our building outright, an asset of at least 6 figures. In 28 years of existence, the entire cash flow of the congregation has been less than \$1.5 million dollars and we have potential assets in the neighborhood of \$200K. A lot of businesses wish they had margins like that.

If Betenu doesn't make it, it's won't be for lack of assets or even membership. We live in a region with 5-URJ congregations within 20 miles of each other. In evaluating where we are and where we want to be, it is a simple question: Do we at Betenu have something to offer our membership that isn't available at one of these other nearby places – and if the answer is yes, you have a head start that the founders of Betenu never had.

My last public event as Rabbi of Betenu is slated to be Chanuka 2012. That gives us about 8 months to review, reminisce and process our 30 years together. Please join us often.


