## Prepare to celebrate Tu B'shevat

Amaze Rav Bryan with your encyclopedic knowledge at Betenu's Tu B'shevat seder on Friday, February 10. Try these challenges:

- Name the seven "fruit" categories of plant specified in Deuteronomy that people try to eat: wheat, barley, grape vines, fig trees, pomegranates, olive trees, honey (from dates!)
- Tu B'shevat is one of four "new years" in the Jewish calendar. The other three are Rosh Hashanah, the first day of Nissan (start of spring, associated with Passover later that month), and the first day of Elul, which used to be the day to establish tithes (think: biblical taxes). This last is no longer observed.
- Because Tu B'shevat is the "birthday" of the trees, taxes on trees were determined by the year in which a tree was planted. If you planted a tree right before Tu B'shevat, it would come of age a year earlier than one planted right after.
