With the new year started, perhaps you're dreaming of the getaway you didn't get in December. It's probably too late to plan for a trip to Israel this month, but here are some fun ideas to start planning for a January 2021 expedition.

- January is part of the rainy season in Israel and the temperatures are cooler. New Englanders would be right at home in northern areas where the temperature drops below freezing and it sometimes snows. However, the water in Eilat remains at about 70 degrees F, so a southern beach outing may be the way to go.
- Skiing is limited in Israel, but Mount Hermon offers skiing if you cannot wait to get home.
- Since Israel is very hot in summer, winter is a good time to visit the warmest areas, such as the Dead Sea, where temperatures can top 100 degrees in summer, but will be more bearable in winter. Similarly, winter is a fine time to visit the Bet Shean Park, home to spectacular Roman and Byzantine ruins.
